As the platoon approached the vehicle, SSG Bamman made the keen observation that the vehicle had moved several hundred meters south of where it was located when the platoon drove on Buick earlier in the patrol, and that this was very suspicious. Based on this observation it was decided that the vehicle should not be approached and that there was a good possibility that the car was perhaps rigged with explosives. When EOD arrived on scene and attempted to blow the trunk off the vehicle, the entire car detonated. The vehicle was a massive VBIED. If SSG Bamman had not noticed the suspicious repositioning at this car, the platoon probably would have dismounted to search the bodies for information. The results could have been catastrophic, however, SSG Bamman's acute observation enabled the Warpigs to make it through the incident unscathed.
