Meeting Held **Everyone Gets Additional Six Months Membership Free** !

At this year's annual membership meeting held at the reunion in Covington KY it was decided to change the membership year. Whether you were aware or not, the membership year started and ended July 1 of each year. Is This Someone I Could Share A Foxhole With ?

Billy Smith, one of our members, sent this article to one of our members (who sent it to me) over the Internet. I thought you would enjoy it.

This article came from Don R Catherall, who has a PHD in psychology and is co-founder and executive director of the Phoenix Institute in Chicago, which specializes in treating trauma survivors of all ages. He has counseled Vietnam Veterans suffering from PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and has been an advisor to the Department of Veterans Affairs. He was a combat soldier with the Marine Corps in '67-'68 and authored "Back from the Brink", a family guide to overcoming traumatic stress.

Catherall believes:

Vietnam Veterans are less likely to blindly accept the orders and perceptions of others. They are perhaps more likely to measure others by reliability, i.e., "Is this someone with whom I could share a foxhole?" They are less hung up on appearances, less easily fooled, and have had enough bullshit thrown at them that they may see through it a little better than others. "I think we share a sadness and a brotherhood that is rare," says Catherall. "It may not be an active part of our lives most of the time, but Vietnam Vets are able to connect in a way that goes very deep. Think about the guys hugging each other at the wall. This is the same thing that the current men's movement is trying to achieve, and it's no accident that the foremost group has chosen the name "Warriors". I think those of us who were real Warriors have found [Iron John] 'wild men' in ourselves." "We know how to take orders and give orders. We have shared our canteens with all classes of people. We've seen death real close up. We've experienced big time loss. We've faced our fears and found our own courage. As a result, we are different in a way that the Indians understood and prized, but which our society does not well understand and so often fears. We have had the experience of being judge, jury, and executioner." "Many of us were free to take life without having to account for our reasons. We were all affected by having that incredible power of living through an experience in which there was no law. We were the law."


Gil & Ray Lewis's father recently died after a short stay in a nursing home. Losing a parent is always difficult.

Dear On-Line Friend:

Since the last time we communicated, there have been several developments in the Congress on the issue of veterans' benefits. Several

"The Veterans' Cost of Living Adjustment Act," HR 3458, was approved by the House of Representatives. This bill would authorize an annual adjustment for veterans' disability and survivor payments, at the same level as for Social Security recipients, currently estimated to be about 2.8 percent. The bill is now under review by the Senate Committee on Veterans Affairs.

New health benefits provisions, in HR 3673, have also passed in the House. These provisions would revise certain veterans' compensation programs, expand the types of educational programs eligible for veterans education benefits, and change VA regulations to provide a presumption of permanent and total disability for veterans over the age of 65 who are in nursing homes. The House has also passed a bill, HR 3674, providing vocational rehabilitation from the VA for veterans who have service-connected disabilities that also constitute an employment handicap.

H.R. 3586 would enhance veterans' employment preferences and extend employment opportunities to non-political jobs in the legislative branch, the judicial branch, the White House, and the General Accounting Office. The House passed this bill July 1996. Authorization to the VA, which provides for the treatment of service members who were exposed to Agent Orange or who served in the

Persian Gulf War, would be extended through 1998 under HR 3643. This authorization is due to expire at the end of 1996. In mid-July, this bill was passed in the House.

Some of these initiatives will now be considered by the Senate. We need to continue to make decisions that ensure that the great sacrifices that were made by our veterans are reflected in the benefits they receive. I assure you I will continue to support measures that protect our veterans and military personnel. If you have any further questions or concerns, please feel free to contact my office.





Gil & Sheilah Presented With Plaque in Appreciation of their Efforts on Behalf of the 1/5 Chapter !




